Feast Days This Week Mon. Nov.2 – The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, (All Souls' Day) Tues. Nov. 3 – St. Martin de Porres, religious Wed. Nov. 4 – St. Charles Borromeo, bishop

All Saints – All Saints' Day commemorates all the saints of the Church, both known and unknown, who have attained heaven. The old term for this day is All Hallows' Day, 'hallow' being another word for 'saint.' The evening before All Hallows' Day was called All Hallows' Eve and then shortened to Halloween. Originally it was a day of preparation for All Hallows' Day or All Saints Day, but has since lost its religious connection. It is now celebrated as a secular day with costumes and decorations commonly associated with death. All Soul's Day follows on Nov. 2, which is a day of prayer and remembrance for all the Faithful Departed.

All Soul's Day – There will be only one Mass for All Souls' Day at 7pm.

Blessed Michael McGivney – On October 31, 2020, Fr. Michael McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, was Beatified. He was born on August 12, 1852, the eldest of 13 children, in Waterbury, Conn. At 16, he began seminary studies and was sent to the College of St. Hyacinthe in Quebec. He also studied at St. Mary's College in Montreal and Our Lady of the Angels Seminary in Niagara Falls, N.Y. He completed his studies at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore and was ordained in 1877 for the Archdiocese of Hartford Conn. He founded the Knights of Columbus in New Haven, Conn. in 1882. The first council in Canada was founded in 1897 in Montreal, where he went to seminary school. The Knights were founded as a group of Catholic laymen in order to strengthen faith and to help families overwhelmed by the illness or death of their breadwinner. He died at age 38 in 1890 during an outbreak known as the Russian flu. He is viewed as a martyr of a pandemic and also a pro-life hero. The miracle recognized by the Vatican for his Beatification, occurred in 2015 and involved a baby, still in utero, with a life-threatening condition. He was healed after his family prayed to Fr. McGivney. His main legacy is the Knights of Columbus, the largest lay Catholic organization in the world with two million members, who sponsor a wide range of educational, charitable and religious activities. He is also the first American parish priest to be Beatified. As a Blessed, his name may now be mentioned in the Eucharistic Prayer and Litany of the Saints. His feast may be celebrated with a special Mass and churches may be built in his honour. Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us.

A Guide to St. Padre Pio Church The Baptismal Font

"I saw the river of life, rising from the throne of God and flowing crystal clear down the middle of the city."

The baptismal font, in the middle of the centre aisle, reminds us of the water of life, flowing through the New Jerusalem. Its octagonal shape represents the seven days of creation plus the eighth day, which is the Day of Resurrection and eternity. It is through the life-giving waters of baptism that we enter into the Resurrection and Eternal Life. The Easter Candle, symbol of the Risen Christ, standing near the font, reinforces that symbolism.
