Advent begins in 2 weeks

Preparing for Advent – Advent has two themes: it prepares us for Christmas; when we recall Jesus' first coming among us, and it is also a time when we look forward to His Coming at the end of the world. Advent is a season of joyful expectation. During advent, each Sunday's Gospel has a specific theme. The Old Testament readings, especially those from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the apostles' present exhortations and instruction on the different themes this season.

The Advent Wreath – The Advent wreath is circular in shape with four candles. Three of the candles are purple to represent penance and longing; they are lit during the first, second and fourth weeks. One of the candles is rose coloured to symbolize joy; it is lit during the third week in glad anticipation of the birth of Jesus. Evergreens, a symbol of eternal life, and purple ribbons symbolic of penance are added in preparation for the Lord's coming.

"You have abandoned the love you had at first. Remember then from what you fallen; repent and do the works you did at first."

Those words from the Book of Revelation remind us of the need to repent. We receive God's grace and life through the waters of Baptism and God's Divine Mercy. But those gifts can become distorted through sin or lost altogether through serious sin. The Sacrament of Reconciliation restores God's grace and life to us. It is almost like a second Baptism, and for this reason the Confessional is close to the baptismal font.

THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS "For you were slaughtered and by your blood you ransomed for God, saints from every tribe and language and people and nation."

It is through the Cross that we are redeemed. The Stations of the Cross is an ancient devotion which meditates on Jesus' walk to Calvary for our salvation. These stations are mosaics which have a gold background to emphasize the Glory of the Cross.

Sacraments for 2021 - Registration: Teaching preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation for 2021 will begin shortly. However, because of the uncertain situation regarding possible vaccines etc. in early 2021, dates for the actual celebrations of these sacraments may not be given at this time. But registration will begin now. If your child attends one of the Catholic schools in our parish, a letter and registration form have already been sent home. If your child attends one of the public or private schools, you must go to the parish website, www.stpp.church, for registration information. The registration forms along with a copy of the baptism certificate must be returned as soon as possible. For any further information, please call the parish at 905-893-7879.

All Souls Envelopes – Because of the pandemic this year, the Book of Life containing all the names of our deceased relatives and friends will not be put out. So, you will not be able to write in any new names this year. However, there will be a wooden box at the front where you can drop an 'All Souls' envelopes with the names of your loved ones who have passed away. The envelopes mare available in the Narthex of the church.
