Nativity Scenes – Beginning on Saturday, Nov. 28, St. Padre Pio presents its tenth Annual Display of Nativity Scenes, entitled 'Joy to the World.' Because of the pandemic, no new nativities will be displayed this year. Nativities from the previous nine years will be displayed again. They represent many different countries and cultures, artistic styles and materials. All of them present the different ways that artists have interpreted the birth of Jesus through the ages. Jesus was born for all people, so his birth is depicted reflecting the different artistic styles found in many cultures. The display, in the cabinets at the side entrance of the church, will continue until Sun. Jan. 10/21, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and the end of the Christmas season.

A Guide to St. Padre Pio Church

THE ALTAR

"There was a golden altar standing in front of the throne...I saw golden lampstands...Blessed are those who are invited to the Wedding Feast of the Lamb."

The focal point of the sanctuary is the altar where the Eucharist, the Wedding Feast of the Lamb, is celebrated. The altar is made of golden Jerusalem limestone from Israel, and it is flanked by four polished candlesticks. Before the altar is the image of the triumphant Lamb of Revelation. St. Padre Pio had great admiration for Pope Pius X, and a relic of St. Pius X has been placed inside the alar.

THE RISEN CHRIST

"I saw a figure like a Son of Man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash across his chest...his face was like the sun shining with all its force."

The large figure of Jesus, on the wall behind the altar, with hands and feet pierced, is the Christ of the Revelation, the Alpha and the Omega, the King of kings and the Lord of lords.

The Sanctuary

"I saw a throne standing in heaven...Round the throne were other throne...There was a rainbow encircling the throne...Before the throne was a sea that seemed to be made of glass, like crystal."

The presider's chair and the two deacon's chairs evoke the image of this opening vision of heaven. The large arch contains lighting and is symbolic of the rainbow above the heavenly throne. The sanctuary floor, glittering with lights from above, is reminiscent of the crystal sea before the throne of God.

An Advent Service for the Home

A member of the family lights one candle on the Advent wreath.

Leader: Rejoice the Lord is at hand. All: Come, Lord Jesus. (A family member reads the suggested bible passage for the day)

Leader: The peace of the Lord be with you. **All**: And also with you.

Leader: Let us pray. Almighty God, be in our midst to cast away all works of darkness, which separate us from You. In Your great mercy, forgive all the things we have done that we should not have done; and all things we failed to do that we should have done; and teach us to live as children of God. This we ask in Jesus name. Amen.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven...Leader: May the almighty and merciful God,Father, Son and Holy Spirit, bless us and keep us.All: Amen.
