Covid Lockdown

The entire Region of York is now in lockdown because of the increase in infections. This also has an impact on our churches. By law, we must restrict attendance inside the church to 10 people. Sadly, due to these measures, by order of the Cardinal, Masses are temporarily cancelled until January 22nd. This includes the whole of the Christmas season. Priests will continue to celebrate private Masses for the intentions of parishioners and for those suffering from the coronavirus. The church is open for private prayer during the normal times, but again, only 10 people are allowed in the church at any one time. Advent-Christmas-Epiphany

The four weeks of Advent that we have celebrated has two main stages: up to December 15, the main emphasis in the Liturgy was on the coming of Christ in final judgment, and on our preparation in joyful hope. The closing days of Advent directed us toward the coming of the Son of God among us as one of us. Truly God and truly human, Jesus has come in love to save us, to make us the people of God, and through us, to continue His work of praising the Father and saving the world. Our celebration of Christmas centres on the great truth of the incarnation; God loves us so much and sent the Son to be one of us, that we might believe and love and have eternal life. The eternal Son of God, our brother, crucified and risen, seated at the right hand of the Father, sending His Spirit to us, and living among us; this is the Lord we celebrate at Christmas.

The Epiphany concludes the Christmas cycle as we celebrate the ways in which God's love is manifested or revealed to us through His Son Jesus. As His Church, we are to continue to be the light of the nations, revealing God's love in Christ through our lives as His followers. The Christmas cycle ends with the feast of the Lord's Baptism.

Epiphany

This feast comes from the East and may date back to the second century. Like the later Western feast of Christmas, it celebrates the Incarnation and work of the Son of God among us. In the East, it is not limited to the visit of the wise men, but involves the Incarnation, Birth, Manifestation and Baptism of the Lord. During the fourth century, the West adopted this feast and the East accepted Christmas. On the Epiphany we celebrate the revelation that God makes to the world in Jesus Christ. He is the image of the God whom we cannot see. He is the light of the world and leads us back to the Father.

Epiphany Blessing

God has called you out of darkness, into His wonderful light. May you experience His kindness and blessings, and be strong in faith, hope and in love. Because you are followers of Christ, who appeared on this day as a light shining in darkness, may He make you a light to all your sisters and brothers. The wise men followed the star, and found Christ who is light from light. May you too find the Lord when your pilgrimage is ended.

Procedures for Marriage Arrangements - Couples planning to be married must contact the priest at least one year in advance. This is an Archdiocesan law and applies to all parishes. At least one party must be a registered member of the parish. If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Archbishop's office has been consulted. Once a date

has been set with the church, then the other arrangements, such as the rental of a hall etc., can be made. In preparation for the marriage, the Catholic party should be attending Sunday Mass each week. The couple will also receive personal preparation for entering marriage through a Marriage Preparation program. Finally, the couple should remember that they are preparing mainly for a marriage, not a wedding. A wedding lasts one day, but marriage lasts forever!

Nativity Scenes –St. Padre Pio presents its tenth Annual Display of Nativity Scenes, entitled 'Joy to the World.' Because of the pandemic, no new nativities will be displayed this year. Nativities from the previous nine years will be displayed again. They represent many different countries and cultures, artistic styles and materials. All of them present the different ways that artists have interpreted the birth of Jesus through the ages. Jesus was born for all people, so his birth is depicted reflecting the different artistic styles found in many cultures. The display, in the cabinets at the side entrance of the church, will continue until Sun. Jan. 10/21, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and the end of the Christmas season.

THE AMBRY

"They anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them."

The Ambry contains the three sacramental oils that are used in the liturgy - The Oil of Catechumens, Sacred Chrism and the Oil of the Sick. Imbued with the power of the Holy Spirit, they are used for Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders and the Anointing of the Sick. The Ambry is an honoured place for these oils, and also a constant reminder of these signs of the Lord's healing, life-giving power.

THE NAVE

"Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth...singing, "to the One seated on the throne and to the Lamb, be blessing and honour and glory and might forever and ever."

The community sits in the nave of the church. It is from here that the people join their voices of heaven and earth, in praise and thanksgiving to God. There are seven stained glass windows in the nave of the church. They depict scenes from the Life of Christ - The Nativity, The Baptism of Jesus, Jesus Healing, Jesus Teaching, Jesus Feeding 5,000, the Transfiguration and Pentecost. Each window contains a stone from the areas where these events took place.
