Last year, generous ShareLife supporters enabled 21,000 people to receive affordable mental health care through family service agencies across the Archdiocese of Toronto, including our community. Our parish goal for this year's campaign is \$85,400. Please give generously.

Confirmation: (for those who missed in 2020) Confirmation Masses wil take place this week as follows:

Tues. Apr. 6 – Public & Private Schools at 6pm Wed. Apr. 7 – Public & Private Schools at 6pm Fri. Apr. 9 – Pope Francis School at 6pm

Because of the limited capacity during the pandemic, only a small number of students at a time may take part in the Mass. This would also include 9 guests for each student, including sponsor and parents. The Mass will be vey simple – no singing (as per the Archdiocese), no lectors, no offertory procession, no robes, and no group photos (as per the Archdiocese). Everyone including the students should be wearing masks for the entire celebration. This is a very difficult time and we are trying to do our best to serve the needs of our students and their families.

Weekday Masses – On Wednesday evening of this week, and on Monday and Wednesday evenings of the next two weeks, there will be Confirmation Masses at 6pm. The 7pm Masses will continue as usual. However, because there will not be time to sanitize the pews after the Confirmations, parishioners are asked to use the side pews for the Parish Mass.

Divine Mercy Celebration – Since the Divine Mercy may not be sung because of the pandemic, and the Divine Mercy booklets may not be given out and returned, again because of the pandemic, there will NOT be a Divine Mercy Celebration this year.

Stations of the Resurrection – For the same reasons given above, there will not be the celebration of the Stations of the Resurrection this year.

Easter Symbols and Customs

Easter Tree – An Easter tradition of European origin, the Easter tree symbolized the joyous season of rebirth. European children celebrated Easter by parading with pussywillows and birch branches laden with catkins. Originally, Easter trees were springblooming branches, brought indoors and placed in a vase of warm water. The warm temperatures and warm water 'forced' spring blossoms. Breaking of the buds symbolized the renewal of life and was a symbol of the Resurrection. Easter trees, in contemporary times, can be a natural branch, a living tree, peg rack trees, artificial trees such as the forsythia, or small replicas which beautifully display a selection of hanging eggs and other ornaments.

<u>Easter Candle</u> – At the Easter Vigil, a large candle, which represents the Risen Christ, is blessed. The Gospel tells us that Jesus is the Light of the World. The flame of the candle is a reminder of this and it is a symbol of Jesus showing himself to His disciples during the forty days after His Resurrection. From Easter to Pentecost the candle has a special place of honour in the sanctuary standing either near the altar or near the lectern. After the Easter season it is placed near the Baptismal font and is also used in the celebration of funerals. Many families use a small white Easter candle at home that is lit during the family meals all through the Easter season.

Easter Lamb – The Easter lamb, representing Christ, with the banner of victory, is one of the most significant symbols of the Easter season. It may be seen in pictures and on cards. The liturgical use of the Pascal lamb as a symbol of Jesus inspired the faithful of medieval times to eat lamb on Easter Sunday. In modern times the custom developed of having an image of the Easter lamb made of pastry or sugar as the centrepiece of the table during the Easter meal. Today many bakeries make these Easter lambs.
